
It is a requirement of the State that a current employee must work at least 1 shift every 120 days to keep your background study current. If you do not work at least 1 shift in 120 days, you are no longer considered employed by Superior and cannot be paid.

Please be mindful of this rule as getting a new background study done involves time and money. If your background has expired, we will need at least 1 week to process and you will not be able to work until your background check has been cleared through the state.

Computer Beware: Ransomware Attack

Ransomware is a kind of malicious software that, as its name implies, takes a computer hostage and holds it for ransom. With ransomware attacks, the malware locks down a target machine, encrypting its data and preventing the owner from accessing it until he or she agrees to pay up.

The latest ransomware attack is "WannaCry" and demands \$300 to get your files back and threatens to delete files if no payment is made within 7 days. What's particularly troubling about this attack is the effect it has on networked computers. Once WannaCry infects one computer, it can spread to every computer on that network within seconds.

The infection typically happens in one of two ways: by clicking on a link or attachment in an email or via an exploit kit released by a compromised website. By sending emails disguised as legitimate messages, the hope for ransomware authors is they can trick users into either opening an infected attachment or clicking a link that takes the user to an infected website. It's a tactic referred to as phishing (attackers try to catch users by luring them into taking the bait). Unfortunately, it can be highly effective, phishing emails have an average open rate of 30%, and research shows ransomware is now the #1 type of malware that phishing delivers (by far).

To avoid raising suspicion, attackers often hide ransomware in the types of attachments we expect to receive — some of the most common include MS Office docs (Word, Excel, and PowerPoint) and PDFs. These documents can be disguised as anything from invoices, contracts, regulatory forms, and more.

You can't prevent attackers from sending ransomware phishing emails, but you can put security controls in place that reduce the risk of users taking the bait, or prevent ransomware from successfully executing even if they do. If possible, it's a good idea to adjust your users' Microsoft Office default settings to disable macros. That way you can prevent ransomware from exploiting them. (Microsoft has a support document that walks you through that process.) Install an ad blocker. This can help protect your users from malicious ads.

Prevention is key. Cyber security experts recommend taking the following precautions to avoid ransomware and other virus or malware attacks:

- Install the Windows security update
- Install anti-virus software
- Don't click on links that you don't recognize. If you receive an email, delete it.
- Don't download files from people that you don't know
- Regularly back up your files


