Celebrating the American Bald Eagle

The bald eagle has been the national bird of the United Sates since 1782, when it was placed with outspread wings on the Great Seal of our country. It has been seen by many as a symbol of strength, courage, freedom and immortality for generations. The bald eagle is highly revered and considered sacred within Native traditions, culture and religion. They are honored with great care and shown the deepest respect.

A bald eagle is not really bald! Their white head may make it look bald. The female eagle is a bit bigger than males. Their bodies can be 3 feet long and their wingspan can be 8 feet across. The average weight of an eagle is 10-14 lbs.. Bald eagles can soar over 10,000 feet high and their great eyesight, at least four times that of a person with perfect vision, lets them see fish up to a mile away. They can drop down at up to 100 miles an hour, gliding just above the water to snag a fish with their feet and flying off to eat it!

It's possible for an eagle in the wild to live longer than thirty years, but the average lifespan is 15 - 20 years. At one time, bald eagles were on the brink of extinction because of hunting, pollution and the use of pesticides. They were placed on the endangered species list in 1978 and removed in 2007. Eagles, their feathers, as well as their nest and roost sites are all protected under multiple federal laws and regulations. Bald eagles are remarkable creatures! Considering their courage, strength, and overall dominant characteristics, it's no wonder why they were chosen as the national symbol of the United States. Long live the bald eagle!
