



Veterans Day is an important day set aside to honor and show appreciation for ALL who have served in the United States military - in wartime or peacetime, living, or deceased. On both Veterans Day and Memorial Day, it's customary to spend time remembering and honoring the countless veterans who have served the United States throughout the country's history. However, there is a distinction between the two holidays. Veterans Day is the day set aside to thank and honor ALL who have served, living or deceased, but in particular the living veterans among us. Memorial Day specifically commemorates the men and women who died while in service of their country and made the ultimate sacrifice for their country.

Veterans Day was originally called Armistice Day in the United States, commemorating the signing of the agreement that ended World War I at 11:00 AM, November 11, 1918. President Woodrow Wilson celebrated the first Armistice Day in 1919. Although this holiday initially honored those who perished in service to their country, when the holiday's name was changed to Veterans Day, it became a day to honor ALL the men and women who have served in the armed forces of the United States.

Remember that Veterans Day is to honor the service of all Americans who have served, but in particular the living veterans among us. Many of our vets stepped in harm's way on our behalf. A few ways you can show vets that you appreciate the sacrifices they made:

If you personally know a veteran, reach out to them on Veterans Day with a phone call or visit!

If you are not close to a veteran, write a thank you card and drop it off at a VA hospital.

Contact Operation Gratitude, which send letters of thanks and care packages to veterans as well as deployed vets. Display the flag proudly to salute our veterans!
