PCA Policy Reminders....

We want to reiterate the following state rules for PCAs that are considered a FEDERAL OFFENSE, if violated. Both the PCA and client are liable as both sign the time worked.

- *PCAs may not take their children with them to work.
- *PCAs may not take their clients to their own homes.
- *PCAs may not claim even 1 hour of time that direct services to their client are not provided.
- *PCAs may not babysit other children in the clients home.
- *PCAs may not sleep while working PCA hours.


